Take Action Project	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Group Take Action Project focuses on something the girls care about that they would like to improve within their Girl Scout or local community. ◆ Puts the Promise and Law into action ◆ Girls can work on project individually, in small groups or as a troop 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Individual or small group (1-4 girls) ◆ Take Action Project that focuses on something the girls care about and better the local neighborhood or Girl Scout or local community. ◆ Has 2-4 volunteers to help with the project ◆ Project benefits 10 or more people if applicable ◆ Puts the Promise and Law into action 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Individual Take Action Project that makes a lasting impact in the local community, region or beyond. ◆ Has five volunteers to help with the project ◆ Project benefits 10 or more People, if applicable ◆ Puts the Promise and Law into action
Sustainability	After the project is complete, girls develop an understanding of sustainability by talking together about how solutions can be lasting.	Girls demonstrate an understanding of sustainability in the project plan and implementation.	Take Action Project includes provisions to ensure sustainability.
Global	After the project is complete, girls develop an understanding of the wider world by talking together about how others may experience the same problem that their project helped resolve.	Girls connect with new friends outside their immediate community, learn how others have solved similar problems and determine if the ideas of others can help with their plan.	Girls identify national and/or global links to their selected issue. They learn from others and develop a plan to share the results of their project beyond the local community.
Project Approval	Troop/Group Volunteer approves project. Girls submits one Bronze Award Brag Sheet per project to the council when the project has been completed to receive official recognition.	<u>GSCP2P requires PRE-Approval beginning October 2021.</u> Silver Award Brag Sheets (one per project) are due upon completion of the project (approved by troop leader/group volunteer), to receive official Council recognition.	Project is approved by the council and Gold Award committee. The girl submits a proposal (through GoGold Online) and has an entry interview for project approval. Girl submits a final report (through GoGold Online), as well as a Gold Award Brag Sheet, and has an exit interview for official final approval and recognition.
